

Generalized Fock space for the Airy operator

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Abstract— In this work, we introduce the Fock space $F_\nu(C)$ associated to the Airy operator, and we establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for this space. Next, we give an application of the theory of extremal function and reproducing kernel of Hilbert space, to establish the extremal function associated to a bounded linear operator $T: F_\nu(C) \rightarrow H$, where H be a Hilbert space. Finally, we come up with some results regarding the extremal functions, when T is the difference operator and the Dunkl-difference operator, respectively.

Keywords—component, Airy-type Fock space, Tikhonov regularization, Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle.

I- Introduction

The study of several generalizations of the classical Fock spaces has a long and rich history in many different settings (see for instance [11], [12]). In this work, we will try to generalize Airy-type Fock space, to establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for this space; and to give an application of the theory of reproducing kernels to the Tikhonov regularization on this generalized Fock space.

The generalized Airy operator (or hyper-Bessel operator [14, 15]) is third singular differential operator given by

$$L_\nu := \frac{d^3}{dx^3} + \frac{3\nu}{x} \frac{d^2}{dx^2} - \frac{3\nu}{x^2} \frac{d}{dx},$$

where ν is a nonnegative real number. When $\nu = 0$, this operator becomes the third derivative operator for which some analysis were studied by Widder [18] and for some special value of ν the operator L_ν appeared as a radial part of the generalized Airy equation of a nonlinear diffusion type partial differential equation in R^n . Recently, in a nice and long paper, Cholewinski and Reneke [2] studied and extended, for the operator L_ν , the well known theory related to some singular differential operator of second order for which the literature is extensive.

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Next, Fitouhi et al. [7, 8] established a harmonic analysis related to this operator for examples the eigenfunctions, the generalized translation, the Fourier-Airy transform, the heat equation, the heat polynomials, the transmutation operators, ... During the last years, the Airy operator have gained considerable interest in various field of mathematics [3-6], [13-15] and in certain parts of quantum mechanics [1]. The results of this work will be useful when discussing the Fock space associated to this operator.

This space is the background of some applications in this contribution. Especially,

- we study the Airy operator and its adjoint operator on the Airy-type Fock space.
- We establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Airy-type Fock space.
- We give an application of the theory of extremal function and reproducing kernel of Hilbert space, to establish the extremal function associated to a bounded linear operator $T: F_\nu(C) \rightarrow H$, where H be a Hilbert space.
- We come up with some results regarding the extremal functions associated to the following operators:

- The difference operator $Tf(z) := \frac{1}{z^3}(f(z) - f(0))$.

- And the Dunkl-difference operator $Tf(z) := \frac{1}{2z^3}(f(z) - f(-z))$

The contents of the paper are as follows. In Section 2, we introduce the Airy-type Fock space $F_\nu(C)$. In Section 3, we establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for this space. In Section 4, we give an application of the theory of reproducing kernels to the Tikhonov regularization problem for bounded linear operator $T: F_\nu(C) \rightarrow H$, where H be a Hilbert space. Next, we come up with some results regarding the Tikhonov regularization problem for the difference operator and the Dunkl-difference operator, respectively.

II- Airy-type Fock space

Let $z \in C$ and $\omega_k = e^{\frac{2i\pi k-1}{3}}$, $k=1,2,3$. A function $u(z)$ is called 3-even if $u(\omega_k z) = u(z)$.

For $\lambda \in C$, the initial problem $L_\nu u(z) = \lambda^3 u(z)$, with $u(0) = 1$ and $u^{(k)}(0) = 0$, $k=1,2$ admits a unique analytic solution on C , which will be denoted by $G_\nu(\lambda z)$ and expanded in power series as

$$G_\nu(\lambda z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\lambda z)^{3n}}{\alpha_{3n}(\nu)}, \text{ where}$$

$$\alpha_{3n}(\nu) = 3^{3n} n! \frac{\Gamma\left(n + \frac{1}{3}\right) \Gamma\left(n + \nu + \frac{2}{3}\right)}{\Gamma\left(\frac{1}{3}\right) \Gamma\left(\nu + \frac{2}{3}\right)}$$

The function $G_\nu(\lambda z)$ is 3-even and defined as the hypergeometric function (see [2]),

$$G_\nu(\lambda z) = {}_0F_2\left[\frac{1}{3}, \nu + \frac{2}{3} \middle| \left(\frac{\lambda z}{3}\right)^3\right].$$

In particular $|G_\nu(\lambda z)| \leq e^{|\lambda||z|}$ and

$$G_0(\lambda z) = \cos_3(-\lambda z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\lambda z)^{3n}}{(3n)!}.$$

We define the Airy-type Fock space $F_\nu(C)$ as the prehilbertian space of 3-even entire functions

$$f(z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} a_n z^{3n} \text{ on } \mathbb{C} \text{ such that}$$

$$\|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} |a_n|^2 \alpha_{3n}(\nu) < \infty.$$

Let f and g be in $F_\nu(C)$ such that $f(z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} a_n z^{3n}$ and

$$g(z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} b_n z^{3n}, \text{ the inner product in } F_\nu(C) \text{ is given by}$$

$$\langle f, g \rangle_{F_\nu(C)} := \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} a_n \bar{b}_n \alpha_{3n}(\nu).$$

The space $F_\nu(C)$ satisfies the following properties.

(i) The function K_ν given by $K_\nu(w, z) = G_\nu(\bar{w}z)$ is a reproducing kernel for the space $F_\nu(C)$.

(ii) If $f \in F_\nu(C)$, then $|f(z)| \leq e^{\frac{|z|^2}{2}} \|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}, z \in \mathbb{C}$.

(iii) The space $F_\nu(C)$ equipped with the inner product

$$\langle \cdot, \cdot \rangle_{F_\nu(C)} \text{ is a Hilbert space; and the set } \left\{ \frac{z^{3n}}{\sqrt{\alpha_{3n}(\nu)}} \right\}_{n \in \mathbb{N}}$$

an Hilbert's basis for the space $F_\nu(C)$.

III. Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle

We consider the following lemmas.

Lemma 3.1. Let $L_\nu : F_\nu(C) \rightarrow F_\nu(C)$, then its adjoint operator L_ν^* is given by $L_\nu^* f(z) = z^3 f(z)$.

Lemma 3.2. $[L_\nu, L_\nu^*] := L_\nu L_\nu^* - L_\nu^* L_\nu = (6+9\nu)I + B_\nu$, where

$$B_\nu f(z) = 9z^2 \frac{d^2}{dz^2} f(z) + 18(1+\nu)z \frac{d}{dz} f(z).$$

Lemma 3.3. Let $F_\nu(C)$. Then

$$\|L_\nu^* f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 = \|L_\nu f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 + (6+9\nu)\|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 + \langle f, B_\nu f \rangle_{F_\nu(C)}.$$

By applying Lemma 3.1, Lemma 3.2, Lemma 3.3 and the following theorem.

Theorem 3.4. (See [9, 10]). Let A and B be self adjoint operators on a Hilbert space H . Then we have

$$\|(A-a)f\|_H \|(B-b)f\|_H \geq \frac{1}{2} |\langle [A, B]f, f \rangle_H|,$$

for all $f \in \text{Dom}(AB) \cap \text{Dom}(BA)$, and all $a, b \in \mathbb{R}$.

We obtain the following Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Airy-type Fock space $F_\nu(C)$.

Theorem 3.5. Let $f \in F_\nu(C)$. For all $a, b \in \mathbb{R}$, we have

$$\|(L_\nu + z^3 - a)f\|_{F_\nu(C)} \|(L_\nu - z^3 + ib)f\|_{F_\nu(C)} \geq A_\nu f,$$

where

$$A_\nu f = \left| (6+9\nu)\|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 + \langle B_\nu f, f \rangle_{F_\nu(C)} \right|.$$

This uncertainty principle can be written as the following form.

Theorem 3.6. Let $f \in F_\nu(C)$. Then

$$\Delta_\nu^+(f) \Delta_\nu^-(f) \geq \|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 (A_\nu f)^2,$$

where

$$\Delta_\nu^\pm(f) = \|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 \|(L_\nu \pm z^3)f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 - \left| \langle (L_\nu \pm z^3)f, f \rangle_{F_\nu(C)} \right|^2.$$

IV. Extremal functions on $F_\nu(C)$

Let $\lambda > 0$ and let $T : F_\nu(C) \rightarrow H$ be a bounded linear operator from $F_\nu(C)$ into a Hilbert space H . We denote by $\langle f, g \rangle_{L, \lambda}$ the inner product defined on the space $F_\nu(C)$ by

$$\langle f, g \rangle_{L, \lambda} := \lambda \langle f, g \rangle_{F_\nu(C)} + \langle Tf, Tg \rangle_H.$$

By using the theory reproducing kernels of Hilbert space and building on the ideas of Saitoh [16,17] we establish the extremal function associated to the operator T on the Airy-type Fock space $F_\nu(C^d)$.

Theorem 4.1. Let $\lambda > 0$. The Fock space $(F_\nu(C), \langle \cdot, \cdot \rangle_{T,\lambda})$ possesses a reproducing kernel $K_{T,\lambda}(w, z)$; $w, z \in C$, which satisfying the equation $(\lambda I + T^*T)K_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot) = K_\nu(w, \cdot)$. Moreover the kernel $K_{T,\lambda}(w, z)$ satisfies the following properties.

- (i) $\|K_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot)\|_{F_\nu(C)} \leq \frac{e^{\frac{|w|^2}{\lambda}}}{\lambda}$,
- (ii) $\|TK_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot)\|_H \leq \frac{e^{\frac{|w|^2}{\lambda}}}{\sqrt{\lambda}}$,
- (iii) $\|T^*TK_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot)\|_{F_\nu(C)} \leq e^{\frac{|w|^2}{\lambda}}$.

From this theorem we obtain the main result of this section.

Theorem 4.2. For any $h \in H$ and for any $\lambda > 0$, there exists a unique function $f_{\lambda,h}^*$, where the infimum

$$\inf_{f \in F_\nu(C)} (\lambda \|f\|_{F_\nu(C)}^2 + \|h - Tf\|_H^2)$$

is attained.

Moreover, the extremal function $f_{\lambda,h}^*$ is given by

$$f_{\lambda,h}^*(w) = \langle h, LK_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot) \rangle_H$$

and satisfies the inequality

$$|f_{\lambda,h}^*(w)| \leq \|h\|_H \frac{e^{\frac{|w|^2}{\lambda}}}{\sqrt{\lambda}}.$$

Application 4.3. Let H be the prehilbertian space of 3-even entire functions $f(z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} a_n z^{3n}$ on C such that

$$\|f\|_H^2 = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} |a_n|^2 \alpha_{3n+3}(\nu) < \infty.$$

The space H is a Hilbert

space with Hilbert's basis $\left\{ \frac{z^{3n}}{\sqrt{\alpha_{3n+3}(\nu)}} \right\}_{n \in \mathbb{N}}$ and reproducing

$$\text{kernel } S_\nu(w, z) = \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\overline{wz})^{3n}}{\alpha_{3n+3}(\nu)}.$$

(i) Let T be the difference operator defined on $F_\nu(C)$ by

$$Tf(z) := \frac{1}{z^3} (f(z) - f(0)).$$

The operator T maps continuously from $F_\nu(C)$ into H , and we have

$$K_{T,\lambda}(w, z) = \frac{1}{\lambda} + \frac{1}{\lambda+1} (G_\nu(\overline{wz}) - 1),$$

$$TK_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot)(z) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1} \frac{G_\nu(\overline{wz}) - 1}{z^3},$$

$$\text{and } f_{\lambda,h}^*(w) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1} w^3 h(w).$$

(ii) Let T be the Dunkl-difference operator defined on

$$F_\nu(C) \text{ by } Tf(z) := \frac{1}{2z^3} (f(z) - f(-z)).$$

The operator T maps continuously from $F_\nu(C)$ into H , and we have

$$K_{T,\lambda}(w, z) = \frac{1}{\lambda} \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\overline{wz})^{6n}}{\alpha_{6n}(\nu)} + \frac{1}{\lambda+1} \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\overline{wz})^{6n+3}}{\alpha_{6n+3}(\nu)},$$

$$TK_{T,\lambda}(w, \cdot)(z) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1} \sum_{n=0}^{\infty} \frac{(\overline{wz})^{6n+3}}{\alpha_{6n+3}(\nu)} z^{6n},$$

$$\text{and } f_{\lambda,h}^*(w) = \frac{1}{2(\lambda+1)} w^3 (h(w) + h(-w)).$$
