## Analytical applications on the Dunkl-type Fock

## space $F_k(C^d)$

Abstract— In this work, we establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$ . Next, we give an application of the classical theory of reproducing kernels to the Tikhonov regularization problem for operator  $L: F_k(C^d) \rightarrow H$ , where H be a Hilbert space. Finally, we come up with some results regarding the Tikhonov regularization problem and the Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transform  $B_k$ .

*Keywords*—component, Dunkl-type Fock spaces, extremal functions, Tikhonov regularization, Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle.

### I- Introduction

In this work, by using the theory of operators on Hilbert spaces [3, 4] we establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$  [1, 11]. In the Dunkl setting, the Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl transform  $D_k$  [2,5], is studied by Rosler in [7] and by Soltani in [15]. This is an important support for show in this work, the Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transfor  $B_k$  [1, 11]. Next, building on the ideas of Matsuura et al. [6], Saitoh [10], and Soltani [12], we give an application of the classical theory of reproducing kernels [9] to the Tikhonov regularization problem on the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$ . More precisely, let  $L: F_k(C^d) \to H$  be a bounded operator from  $F_k(C^d)$  into a Hilbert space H,

Akram Nemri Department of Mathematics Faculty of Science, Jazan University Jazan, Saudi Arabia for all  $\lambda \succ 0$ ,  $h \in H$ , the infimum  $\inf_{f \in F_k(C^d)} \left( \lambda \|f\|_{F_k(C^d)}^2 + \|h - Lf\|_H^2 \right)$ , is attained at one function  $f_{\lambda,h}^*$ , called the extremal function. As applications,

we study the extremal functions associated to the following operators:

- the operator  $Lf(w) = (B_k)^{-1} f(w)$ ,

- the operator 
$$Lf(w) = (D_k)^{-1} (B_k)^{-1} f(w)$$
,

- and the operator Lf(w) = f(-iw).

In the Dunkl setting, the extremal functions are studied by Soltani in several directions, where L is the Dunkl-type Weierstrass transform [12], L is the Dunkl multiplier operators [13,16] and L is the dual Dunkl-Sonine operator [14].

The contents of the paper are as follows. In Section 2, we recall some properties of the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$  and we establish Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for this space. In Section 3, we give an application of the classical theory of reproducing kernels to the Tikhonov regularization problem for bounded operator  $L: F_k(C^d) \rightarrow H$ , where H be a Hilbert space. The last section is devoted to give some results concerning the Tikhonov regularization problem and the Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transform  $B_k$ .

### п- Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann space

The Dunkl operators  $T_j(k)$ ; j=1,...,d, on  $R^d$  associated with the positive root system  $\Re$  + and the multiplicity function k are given, for a function f of class  $C^1$  on  $R^d$  , by

$$T_{j}(k)f(x) \coloneqq \frac{\partial}{\partial x_{j}} f(x) + \sum_{\alpha \in \Re+} k(\alpha)\alpha_{j} \frac{f(x) - f(\sigma_{\alpha}x)}{\langle \alpha, x \rangle}$$
  
where  $\sigma_{\alpha}x \coloneqq x - \frac{2\langle \alpha, x \rangle}{|\alpha|^{2}}\alpha$ .

For  $y \in \mathbb{R}^d$ , the initial problem  $T_j(k)u(.,y)(x) = y_ju(x,y)$ , j = 1,...,d, with u(0, y) = 1 admits a unique analytic solution on  $\mathbb{R}^d$ , which will be denoted by  $E_k(x, y)$  and called Dunkl kernel [2]. This kernel has a unique analytic extension to  $\mathbb{C}^d \times \mathbb{C}^d$  (see [8]).

For  $z, w \in C^d$ , we define  $K(z, w) := E_k(z, \overline{w})$ .

From the properties of the Dunkl kernel [2, 8], the kernel K is continuous and the function  $z \to K(z,.)$  is holomorphic for all  $w \in C^d$ . Further,  $K(z,w) = \overline{K(w,z)}$  and K(z,w) is a positive definite kernel. Then, there exists a Hilbert space  $F_k(C^d)$  of holomorphic functions on  $C^d$  such that K is its reproducing kernel. The Hilbert space  $F_k(C^d)$  contains the C-algebra  $P(C^d)$  of polynomial functions on  $C^d$  as a dense subspace. In particular, if we denote by  $\langle ., \rangle_{F_k(C^d)}$  the inner product in

 $F_k(C^d)$ , then

$$\langle p,q \rangle_{F_k(C^d)} = p(T(k))\overline{q(z)}_{z=0}, p,q \in P(C^d),$$

where p(T(k)) is the operator formed by replacing  $z_j$  by  $T_j(k)$  for j = 1, ..., d. We shall call  $F_k(C^d)$  the Dunkl-type Fock space.

# m- Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle

We consider the following general result from functional analysis.

**Theorem 3.1.** (See [3, 4]). Let A and B be self adjoint operators on a Hilbert space H. We define the commutator of A and B to  $[A,B] \coloneqq AB - BA$ . Then we have that

$$\|(A-a)f\|_{H}\|(B-b)f\|_{H} \ge \frac{1}{2}|\langle [A,B]f,f\rangle_{H}|$$
, for all

 $f \in Dom(AB) \cap Dom(BA)$ , and all  $a, b \in R$ . By applying Theorem 3.1 we establish the Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$ .

**Theorem 3.2.** Let  $f \in F_k(C^d)$ . For all  $a, b \in R$ , we have

$$\left\| (T_{j}(k) + z_{j} - a)f \right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})} \left\| (T_{j}(k) - z_{j} + ib)f \right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})} \ge N_{k}(f)$$

where 
$$N_k(f) = \left\| \|f\|_{F_k(C^d)}^2 + \langle P_j(k)f, f \rangle_{F_k(C^d)} \right\|$$
  
and  $P_j(k)f(z) = \sum_{\alpha \in \Re^+} k(\alpha)(\alpha_j)^2 f(\sigma_\alpha z).$ 

This uncertainty principle can be written as the following.

**Theorem 3.3**. Let  $f \in F_k(C^d)$ . Then

$$M_{k}^{+}(f)M_{k}^{-}(f) \geq \left\|f\right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})}^{2}(N_{k}(f))^{2}$$
  
where

$$M_{k}^{\pm}(f) = \left\|f\right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})}^{2} \left\|A_{k}^{\pm}(f)\right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})}^{2} - \left|\left\langle A_{k}^{\pm}(f), f\right\rangle_{F_{k}(C^{d})}\right|^{2} \\ A_{k}^{\pm}(f) = (T_{j}(k) \pm z_{j})f.$$

### IV- Extremal functions on $F_k(C^d)$

Let  $\lambda \succ 0$  and let  $L: F_k(C^d) \rightarrow H$  be a bounded linear operator from  $F_k(C^d)$  into a Hilbert space H. We denote by  $\langle f, g \rangle_{L,\lambda}$  the inner product defined on the space  $F_k(C^d)$  by

$$\langle f,g \rangle_{L,\lambda} \coloneqq \lambda \langle f,g \rangle_{F_k(C^d)} + \langle Lf,Lg \rangle_H.$$

By using the theory of extremal function and reproducing kernel of Hilbert space [9,10] we establish the extremal function associated to the operator L on the Dunkl-type Fock space  $F_k(C^d)$ .

**Theorem 4.1.** Let  $\lambda \succ 0$ . The Fock space  $(F_k(C^d), \langle ., \rangle_{L,\lambda})$  possesses a reproducing kernel  $K_{L,\lambda}(w, z)$ ;  $w, z \in C^d$ , which satisfying the equation  $(\lambda I + L^*L)K_{L,\lambda}(w, .) = K(w, .)$ . Moreover the kernel  $K_{L,\lambda}(w, z)$  satisfies the following properties

(i) 
$$\left\|K_{L,\lambda}(w,.)\right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})} \leq \frac{\sqrt{E_{k}(w,\overline{w})}}{\lambda},$$
  
(ii)  $\left\|LK_{L,\lambda}(w,.)\right\|_{H} \leq \sqrt{\frac{E_{k}(w,\overline{w})}{\lambda}},$   
(iii)  $\left\|L^{*}LK_{L,\lambda}(w,.)\right\|_{F_{k}(C^{d})} \leq \sqrt{E_{k}(w,\overline{w})}.$ 

From this theorem we obtain the main result of this section . **Theorem 4.2.** For any  $h \in H$  and for any  $\lambda \succ 0$ , there exists a unique function  $f_{\lambda,h}^*$ , where the infimum

$$\inf_{f \in F_k(C^d)} \left( \lambda \| f \|_{F_k(C^d)}^2 + \| h - Lf \|_H^2 \right)$$
 is attained.

Moreover, the extremal function  $f_{\lambda,h}^*$  is given by

$$\begin{aligned} f_{\lambda,h}^{*}(w) &= \left\langle h, LK_{L,\lambda}(w, .) \right\rangle_{H} \text{ and satisfies the inequality} \\ \left| f_{\lambda,h}^{*}(w) \right| &\leq \sqrt{\frac{E_{k}(w, \overline{w})}{\lambda}} \left\| h \right\|_{H}. \end{aligned}$$

## v- Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transform

Let  $\mathcal{O}_k$  denote the weight function  $\mathcal{O}_k(y) \coloneqq \prod_{\alpha \in \Re_+} |\langle \alpha, y \rangle|^{2k(\alpha)}, \quad y \in \mathbb{R}^d.$ 

Let  $C_k$  be the Mehta-type constant given by

$$c_k \coloneqq \left( \int_{\mathbb{R}^d} e^{-|y|^2} \omega_k(y) dy \right)^{-1}$$

We denote by  $\mu_k$  the measure on  $\mathbb{R}^d$  given by  $d\mu_k(y) \coloneqq c_k \omega_k(y) dy$ , and by  $L_k^2(\mathbb{R}^d)$ , the space of measurable functions f on  $\mathbb{R}^d$ , such that

$$\|f\|_{L^2_k(\mathbb{R}^d)} \coloneqq \left(\int_{\mathbb{R}^d} |f(y)|^2 dy\right)^{\frac{1}{2}} \prec \infty.$$

We denote by  $U_k$  the kernel given for  $z, w \in C^d$ , by

$$U_k(z,w) := e^{\frac{(\langle z,z\rangle + \langle w,w\rangle)}{2}} E_k(\sqrt{2}z,w).$$

The kernel  $U_k$  gives rise to an integral transform

 $\pmb{B}_k$ , which is called Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transform on

 $C^d$ , and defined for f in  $L_k^2(\mathbb{R}^d)$ , by  $B_k(f)(z) \coloneqq \int_{\mathbb{R}^d} U_k(z, x) f(x) d\mu_k(x), \ z \in C^d$ .

The transform  $B_k$  is an isometric isomorphism of  $L_k^2(\mathbb{R}^d)$  onto  $F_k(\mathbb{C}^d)$ , and for  $f \in L_k^2(\mathbb{R}^d)$  we have  $\|B_k(f)\|_{F_k(\mathbb{C}^d)} = \|f\|_{L_k^2(\mathbb{R}^d)}$ ,

$$B_k D_k(f)(w) = B_k(f)(-iw), \quad w \in \mathbb{C}^d,$$

where  $D_k$  is the Dunkl transform [2,5].

Application 5.1. (i) If  $H = L_k^2(R^d)$  and  $L = (B_k)^{-1}$ ,

then  $L^* = B_k$  and  $L^*L = I$ . Thus, by Theorem 4.1, we

deduce that  $K_{L,\lambda}(w,z) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1}K(w,z)$ , and for  $h \in L^2_k(\mathbb{R}^d)$ ,  $f^*_{\lambda,h}(w) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1}B_k(h)(w)$ .

(ii) If  $H = F_k(C^d)$  and Lf(w) = f(-iw), then  $L^*f(w) = f(iw)$  and  $L^*L = I$ . Thus, by Theorem 4.1, we deduce that  $K_{L,\lambda}(w,z) = \frac{1}{\lambda + 1}K(w,z)$ , and for

$$h \in F_k(C^d), f^*_{\lambda,h}(w) = \frac{1}{\lambda+1}h(iw).$$

**Application 5.2.** By applying Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl transform ([15], Theorem 2), we deduce the following Heisenberg-type uncertainty principle for the Dunkl-type Segal-Bargmann transform  $B_k$ .

Let  $a \succ 0$ . There exists  $C_a \succ 0$  such that for all  $f \in L^2_{\mathbb{H}}(\mathbb{R}^d)$  we have

$$\left\| e^{\frac{|x|^2}{2}} f \right\|_{L^2_k(\mathbb{R}^d)} \le C_a \left\| x \right\|^a e^{\frac{|x|^2}{2}} f \left\| \int_{L^2_k(\mathbb{R}^d)}^{\frac{1}{a+1}} \left[ \sum_{j=1}^d \left\| z_j B_k(f) \right\|_{F_k(\mathbb{C}^d)}^2 \right]^{\frac{1}{2a+2}} \right\|_{L^2(\mathbb{R}^d)}$$
