⁹⁷ Then what happened after that? Listen! After that attack, his voice became quiet, nobody heard him no more. God called him off the scene, said, 'Elijah, you've done made your Message known to all of Israel, they know It. Now come up here in the wilderness, get away from them, separate yourself 'cause I'm going to do something. I'm going to show them what it is to turn My Message down.' What set in? War, famine, starvation.

⁹⁸THUS SAITH THE HOLY SPIRIT, 'Watch what's coming! Watch what's going to follow! There was a famine, there will be a famine!' Oh, maybe not for bread, but for hearing the Word of God and His Truth (...).

¹⁰⁰ When God sends forth a Message and tells the people, and they don't receive It, then He withdraws His servant and sends His plagues: famine, death (spiritually speaking, physically also). You watch for a depression, brother. You think you've seen something, you just wait after while. You haven't seen nothing. You think you are dying for a good spiritual revival, you wait till after a bit. You just wait, long and cry to hear the Word of God. The Bible said so! 'There'll be a famine in the last days,' said the prophet, 'and not for bread and water alone, but for hearing the true Word of God.' But that voice will be quiet, in the wilderness somewhere, hid away.

(...) ¹⁰² Then one day, after sin had took its toll, and God had brought His people to their knees...Jezebel took everything, she wiped it all up, and she'll do it again! That's THUS SAITH GOD'S HOLY BIBLE, 'She'll do it again.' She's right on the throne now, behind the figurehead; twisting it anyway she wants to, nobody's going to stop her. Now we can see where we are on this Last Day. We are in the time when there is hunger on Earth, as the prophet Amos says in chapter 8, and verse 11 and on, "yet not a famine of bread (literal), neither a thirst for water (literal), but of hearing of the Word of God," of hearing the Word that proceeds from the mouth of God.

And people will go wandering from one nation to another nation, they will go through different continents looking for the Word of God and they will not find it, except in the territory where the mouth of God is, where the Angel of the Lord Jesus Christ is. And from that mouth of God, which is the mouth of Jesus Christ, the messenger of Jesus Christ, will come forth the Word of God, the spiritual food for the soul of each one of the sons and daughters of God.

There is hunger in the soul of human beings, there is spiritual hunger in the soul of the youth; that is why we find that in some countries a great part of the youth has gone astray and has gone to vices, to drugs, and to countless negative things that have affected the youth; and consequently have affected the families, and consequently have affected the nations. It is that there is hunger in people's souls.

And as it happens physically: the person feels hungry when he has nothing to eat; and if he doesn't find anything to eat, the person becomes weaker, he becomes sick, and health problems come to the person; and he contracts any disease and the person dies or dies of weakness.

And so it is with the youth in all nations, as well as children and as well as adults; just as we need physical food for our physical body, we need spiritual food for our soul. Jesus Christ said: "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God."

Sometimes we take care of feeding our physical body, but we forget to feed the most important thing, which is our soul; and our soul has to be well fed with the Word of God that corresponds to the time in which the person lives.

A person physically can't say: "I ate yesterday or I ate last week, so I don't have to eat today." Jesus Christ said that, while praying, one of the things we should ask for was our daily bread. A person doesn't say: "Since I ate yesterday, I'm not going to eat today; I already ate yesterday, I don't need any more food." He doesn't say that, rather he says: "I ate yesterday, but that was yesterday; I need food, today's food." And so it is needed spiritually as well.

God has given us spiritual food for previous days, for previous stages, for previous ages and dispensations. And for this time we need the spiritual food of our age, of our spiritual day, of the Last Day; and that Food is the Word of God promised for this time, the Message of the Great Voice of Trumpet, which is the Message of the Gospel of the Kingdom, making known to us all these things that must happen soon.

A person will be hungry in his soul and will become weak without that Message. But when he eats the spiritual food relevant to the Last Day, he receives spiritual strength to live and to fight, and to always walk forward serving our beloved Lord Jesus Christ.

And the vices of the youth disappear, because vices are like germs, like those diseases that stick to people; and if they are weak, they send them to bed, they send them to the hospital. But people, when they keep themselves well nourished, keep their immune level high, they keep themselves in good health.

And our youth needs to be in good health; and spiritual health is indispensable to have a healthy youth mentally, spiritually and also physically; because when the youth is spiritually healthy, they get a good mental health, and they also get a good physical health. Why? Because the money he earns, he doesn't invest it in vices, but he uses it to feed himself well; and he leads a good life, a productive life, a favorable life for his home, for his community, for his nation, for his Church, for all those around him, and for himself.

And that is how we want our youth.

But for that we need them to eat spiritual food for the soul; "for man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God."¹ And the youth is spiritually hungry, hungry to hear the Word of God.

And when he hears it, there in his soul he feels that Food, those vitamins, and he receives that strength; and he says: "This is what I was waiting for, this is what I needed." And he begins to feel spiritually strong, and he says to the vices: "Get away from me, get out of my way, I serve Christ and I serve my community and I serve my nation." And he makes good use of the days of life that God has given him. This is how we want our youth.

Being well fed we have a hope of eternal life with our beloved Lord Jesus Christ, we have a firm faith in what Christ has promised for believers in Him.
